### Overview of the school

### Nature of support

During the academic year 2016/2017 (September 2016 to July 2017) support given and planned for which is funded by the Sports Premium is as follows:

- Autumn term (2016) will include the use of the professional services of a games expert to take games based PE lessons and create planning with teachers in KS1. Teachers will also benefit from observing the games expert to reflect on and improve their own practice.
- Additionally in the Autumn term the use of the professional services of a dance expert to include choreography for the Christmas productions.
- Spring term (2017) will include the use of the professional services of a gym expert to take gym based PE lessons and create planning with teachers in EYFS & KS1. Teachers will also benefit from observing the gym expert to reflect on and improve their own practice.

### Curriculum focus of Sports Premium spending

- Improve teacher confidence in delivering games lessons within KS1
- Improve teacher confidence in delivering gym lessons within KS1
- Use the professional expertise of qualified gym and games teachers to create a library of lesson plans and resources for the future.
- To inspire the children to enjoy gym and games.

### Measuring the impact of Sports Premium spending

- Observations of gym lessons will show improvements in the quality of teaching and learning.
- Observations of games lessons will show improvements in the quality of teaching and learning.
- Dance performances in the Christmas productions and year group assemblies are of an improved standard and quality.
- Lesson planning for gym and games is more complex and uses technical vocabulary as well as being more detailed and easy to follow.
- A wider variety of resources are utilised to provide more stimulating and engaging lessons.
